## **OPEN GARDENS FRIDAY 13 JUNE 2025**

- 1 Mayfield Terrace (Hazel and Walter Clark) will be open from 7.00pm and they will host the refreshments.

#### **PLANNING**

There have been regular applications from local residents to install slim heritage double glazing units into their existing window frames. These have all been approved – others are using secondary glazing. It's great to see new solutions that allow us to improve warmth and reduce heating bills while retaining the appearance of these buildings.

We submitted two objections to further developments at the Salisbury Arms. Although there were some minor improvements made, the application has now been approved and will lead to a significant increase in outdoor seating. We will need to keep a close eye on any additional noise as a result -the decision stated that there would be none! We have recently submitted an objection to plans to knock down 33 - 41 Ratcliffe Terrace to build 115 student rooms.

### GRANGE AND PRESTONFIELD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Elections to the GPCC and other Community councils took place in March. Enough residents have stood for election to continue the operation of the GPCC. After nearly five years as chair, Ian Chisholm is stepping down but will continue to represent the Blacket Association on the GPCC. This link enables us to keep-up-to-date with Council activities.
